Rick Dollahan- Auditor stated that Budget starts today and the first budget workshop will be May 29, 2019. Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve administrative items as presented. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)
2. Consider renewing the service agreement with Trane for the Gaines County Courthouse and the Gaines County Jail; take action as appropriate

Judge Keyes stated that this item would be tabled in order for the Auditor and County Attorney to review the agreement.
3. Consider approving a new transaction fee for J.P. Precincts 1 and 2; take action as appropriate

Judge James, Justice of the Peace, stated that this was a \$2.00 fee for court. Commissioner Rosson made a motion to approve the new transaction for J.P. Precincts 1 & 2. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Murphree stated that 6 men were wanting to have a row of T-hangers built in row A and they have a contractor willing to build. Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the routine administrative items as presented. Commissioner Murphree seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

2. Consider three resolutions to support bills to name portions of US 62, US 385, and US 180 for Dell Ross Claiborne, Irvin "Butch" Hill, and Bob Ford respectively, all three were Gaines County residents who gave their lives for our country in Vietnam; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the three resolutions to support bills to designate portions of US Highway 62 as The Dell Ross Claiborne Memorial Highway, US Highway 385 as The Irvin "Butch" Hill Memorial Highway and US Highway 180 as The Bob Ford Memorial Highway. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

3. Meet with Shelby Concotelli to discuss July 4 Celebration; take action as appropriate

Shelby Concotelli with the Chamber of Commerce stated that the July 4th Celebration would be held June 29th. Shelby requested approval for trash clean up the morning after the event and also requested the use of the large trash cans used last year. Commissioner Houston made a motion to approve the use of the trash cans and contacting Robert Soto on picking up trash the morning after the event. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

4. Consider approving Treasurers quarterly report; take action as appropriate

Michael Lord, Treasurer, stated that total funds for the second quarter was \$38,576.687.98 and total interest was \$212,154.42. Commissioner Houston made a motion approving the Treasurers quarterly report. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

5. Meet with Michael Lord concerning wellness testing; take action as appropriate

Michael Lord, Treasurer stated that at this time he was just reporting the wellness testing would be conducted by Covenant Health Screening and they would bring the unit here on September 4th & 5th. No action taken.

6. Consider accepting gifts for Summer Reading Program; take action as appropriate

Sabra Hall, Interim Librarian presented a list of gifts for the Summer Reading Program for approval. Commissioner Rosson made a motion to accept the gifts for the Summer Reading Program. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

7. Consider increasing part time funds for the Maintenance Department by \$22,000.00; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the increase of part time funds for the Maintenance Department to \$22,000.00. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

8. Consider approving additional hours for temporary help in maintenance; take action as appropriate

Michael Lord, Treasurer, stated the need for the temporary help to be increased to full time hours until as such time the employee returns from surgery leave. Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the additional hours for the temporary help in maintenance. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

9. Consider updating the AT&T contract to the new State DIR contract; take action as appropriate

Scott Shortes, IT Director, stated that the new State DIR contract would be a savings of \$400 monthly. Scott stated that incoming and outgoing calls will never go down with this new contract. Commissioner Murphree made a motion to approve updating the AT&T contract to the new State DIR contract. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously (see attached)

10. Consider replacing 3 public computers at Seminole and 1 at Seagraves Libraries with 4 chrome boxes for e-Libris Technologies; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Rosson made a motion to approve the replacement of 3 public computers at Seminole and 1 at Seagraves Libraries with 4 chrome boxes as presented by Scott Shortes, IT Director. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

11. Open bids for side dump trailer for Precinct 1; take action as appropriate

Judge Keyes stated 1 bid was received from Bruckner Truck Sales Inc for a 2019 side dump truck in the amount of \$47,990.00 for Precinct 1. Commissioner Rosson made a motion to accept the bid from Bruckner Truck Sales Inc. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

12. Open bids for side dump trailer for Precinct 4; take action as appropriate

Judge Keyes stated 1 bid was received from Bruckner Truck Sales Inc for a 2020 side dump truck in the amount of \$47,990.00 for Precinct 4. Commissioner Houston made a motion to accept the bid from Bruckner Truck Sales Inc. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

13. Consider a Buy Board purchase for Precinct 1 of a wheel loader; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Rosson made a motion to authorize a Buy Board purchase for Precinct 1 for a 2019 Caterpillar wheel loader from Warren CAT in the amount of \$132,769.00. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

14. Consider a purchase of new chairs for the Seagraves Community Center; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Rosson stated that the current chairs were the older metal ones and needed to be replaced with the stackable chairs like the ones purchased for the new Civic Center. Rick Dollahan, Auditor, stated that this purchase would come out of the Capital Project fund. Commissioner Rosson made a motion to approve the purchase of the new chairs for the Seagraves Community Center. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

15. Consider approving a new hanger at the airport; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Murphree stated that JW & T requested approval to build a 75x88 hanger south of their current hanger with a hall connecting the 2 hangers. Commissioner Murphree made a motion to approve the new hanger to be built at the airport. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

16. Consider approving the hanger lease agreement for the airport; take action as appropriate

Judge Keyes stated that the 2nd paragraph was edited to add conditions that an annual review for each person signing the lease agreement would be done at budget time. Judge Keyes also stated that the lease had been reviewed by Joe Nagy, County Attorney and waiting on review from Charles Kimbrough with Bickerstaff, Heath, Delgado & Acosta. Commissioner Murphree stated that each person signing the lease would do so before any hanger construction was started. Commissioner Murphree made a motion to approve the hanger lease agreement for the airport pending review by Charles Kimbrough. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

17. Consider approving a transfer of funds from Precinct 4 to Precinct 2 for oil; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Houston made a motion to approve the transfer of funds from Precinct 4 to Precinct 2 to restock 24 gallons of oil used by Precinct 4. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

18. Consider approving transfer of equipment from Precinct 4 to Precinct 3; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Houston made a motion to approve the transfer of a 2002 Ford distributor, Unit #711 from Precinct 4 to Precinct 3. Commissioner Murphree seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

19. Consider approving transfer of funds from Precinct 3 to Precinct 4 to purchase equipment; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Houston stated that there was an appraisal of the 2002 Ford distributor, Unit #711 with the appraisal value of \$20,000.00 and also stated Precinct 3 would pay ½ the value. Commissioner Murphree made a motion to approve the transfer of funds in the amount of \$10,000.00 from Precinct 3 to Precinct 4. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

20. Consider approving purchase of distributor for Precinct 4; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Houston made a motion to approve a Buy Board purchase of a 2020 Mack Granite 64ft distributor for Precinct 4. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

21. Consider approving lowering speed limit on a section of CR 208 to thru traffic; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve lowering the speed limit on a section of CR 208 to 50 miles an hour. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

22. Consider approving improvements on Higginbotham Building; take action as

Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the improvements of a new ceiling, lights & air conditioner ducts on Higginbotham Building with money gifted from Lea County Co-op. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

23. Consider approving subdivision application(s); take action as appropriate.

Commissioner Houston made a motion to approve the first reading of the Flatland Estates Addition A & B from David Oats. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

- c. Commissioner Rosson stated that an oil company had contacted him wanting a line laid down in a ditch, he declined stating that we take care of the ditches and he would not allow lines to be laid.
- d. Commissioner Rosson stated he would be willing to give any of the old metal chairs he has to any county entity that needed them. He requesting giving some to the Lamesa prison ministry. Rick Dollahan, County Auditor, stated it would have to be an agenda item for approval.
- e. Judge Keyes stated the bill for year around firework sales was not approved in the Senate.
- f. Rick Dollahan stated a company had just come in his office and solicited the county for repairs on the county buildings from weather damages. He told them they could not be put on the agenda, reminding the court that a few years ago our buildings had minor cosmetic damage and was not repaired. Judge Keyes stated that he would contact our Insurance agent Carrol Harallson and request an adjuster to assess damages.

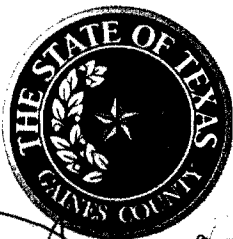

1. Discuss routine administrative items: take action as appropriate:

Judge Keyes stated that there was a bill before Legislation waiting for approval regarding Commissioners Court being held on Mondays and not the Wednesday before each payroll. Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the routine administrative items as presented. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

2. Consider joining TexBuy, a cooperative purchasing program for goods and services; take action as appropriate

Scott Shortes, IT Director, stated that TexBuy was a local buy board for the surrounding area. Scott stated using this buy board could result in savings for the county. Judge Keyes read aloud the Resolution by TexBuy. Judge Keyes stated the County Attorney had reviewed and approved the resolution. Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the joining of TexBuy and appointing Judge Keyes as the contact person for TexBuy. Commissioner Murphree seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

3. Consider a contract to repair floors in kitchen of Civic Bldg and in a holding cell at the Jail; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Belt stated that there was an area on the kitchen floor of the Civic Building that had been stripped of its shine and damaged. Commissioner Belt stated that the cost to repair was too extensive and the cost would be 7,020.00 and requested it not be repaired. Judge Keyes stated that the flooring in the showers at the jail needed to be repaired at a cost of \$273. Commissioner Belt made a motion to deny repairing the Civic Building floor and to approve the repair of the flooring at the jail. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

4. Consider applying for Unclaimed Property Capital Credits for Counties; take action as appropriate

Judge Keyes stated that the Unclaimed Property Capital Credit funds were used for the story tellers in the library. Rick Dollahan, Auditor stated the current balance for this was \$13,653.00. Commission Rosson made a motion to authorize applying for the Unclaimed Property Capital Credits. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

5. Consider appending the TCEQ Regulatory Guidance on General Permit Storm Water and General Permit Wastewater Fee to the Gaines County Subdivision Regulations as guidance to individuals seeking to subdivide land; take action as appropriate

Commissioner Murphree stated he had complaints of storm water and wastewater going into fenced areas. Chuck Kimbrough suggested appending the TECQ Regulatory Guidance within the current Subdivision agreement. Commissioner Rosson made a motion declining appending the TCEQ Regulatory Guidance on General Permit Storm Water and General Permit Wastewater to the current Subdivision Regulations and at the time the regulation is signed to inform the individual they have to comply with state and federal rules and supply a copy of the regulations. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

6. Consider comments from Chuck Kimbrough on the newly proposed, and provisional, hanger lease agreement for the GC Airport, determine appropriate action to take in regards to the new lease; take action as appropriate

Judge Keyes stated that Chuck Kimbrough did not suggest long term leases. Joe Nagy, County Attorney stated that he had reviewed the lease agreement and approved it. Commissioner Murphree made a motion to continue with the lease as currently worded. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

7. Consider accepting a gift of materials and labor for the rebuilding of a portion of CR 324; take action as appropriate
